### From the Director's Desk:





#### **WISER Woman:**




Our WISER Woman for June is Dr. Mary Anne Jackson, Dean of the UMKC School of Medicine. She is a member of the National Vaccine Advisory Committee and the American Academy of Pediatrics Committee on Infectious Diseases, where her work focuses on educating practitioners in strategies to reduce vaccine hesitancy and improve vaccine coverage for pediatric and adult vaccines. Dr. Jackson focuses on describing the epidemiology of vaccine preventable infections and studying new vaccines through work with the NIH-based Vaccine and Education Unit at the CDC-sponsored New Vaccine Surveillance Network.
