From the Director's Desk:









Dr. Bettenhausen is a practicing pediatric hospitalist and serves as the Director of the Division of Pediatric Hospital Medicine at Children's Mercy Kansas City. Prior to leading the division, Dr. Bettenhausen served as the Research Director and had the opportunity to invest in young researchers within the division, the hospital, and nationally. Dr. Bettenhausen's own research aims to reduce health care disparities and to create a measurable improvement in health outcomes for children exposed to adverse social conditions. This month our featured researcher is Dr. Kattesh V. Katti, Ph.D, Director of the Institute of Green Nanotechnology, Director of University of Missouri Cancer Nanotechnology Platform, Margaret Proctor Mulligan Professorship in Medical Research. Dr. Katti's research is focused on targeting cancer with nanoparticles though the development of molecular imaging and therapy agents including gamma- and positron-emitting isotopes for imaging and beta-emitting isotopes for therapy.
